The 11.4 debt service mills will be a continuing debt service tax until the retirement of proposed bonds to be issued in the principal amount of \$4,000,000 and which will mature in 2046 and will be issued for the purpose of refunding the Districts bonds, dated December 1, 2016 and for erecting and equipping school facilities and making additions and improvements to existing facilities.
